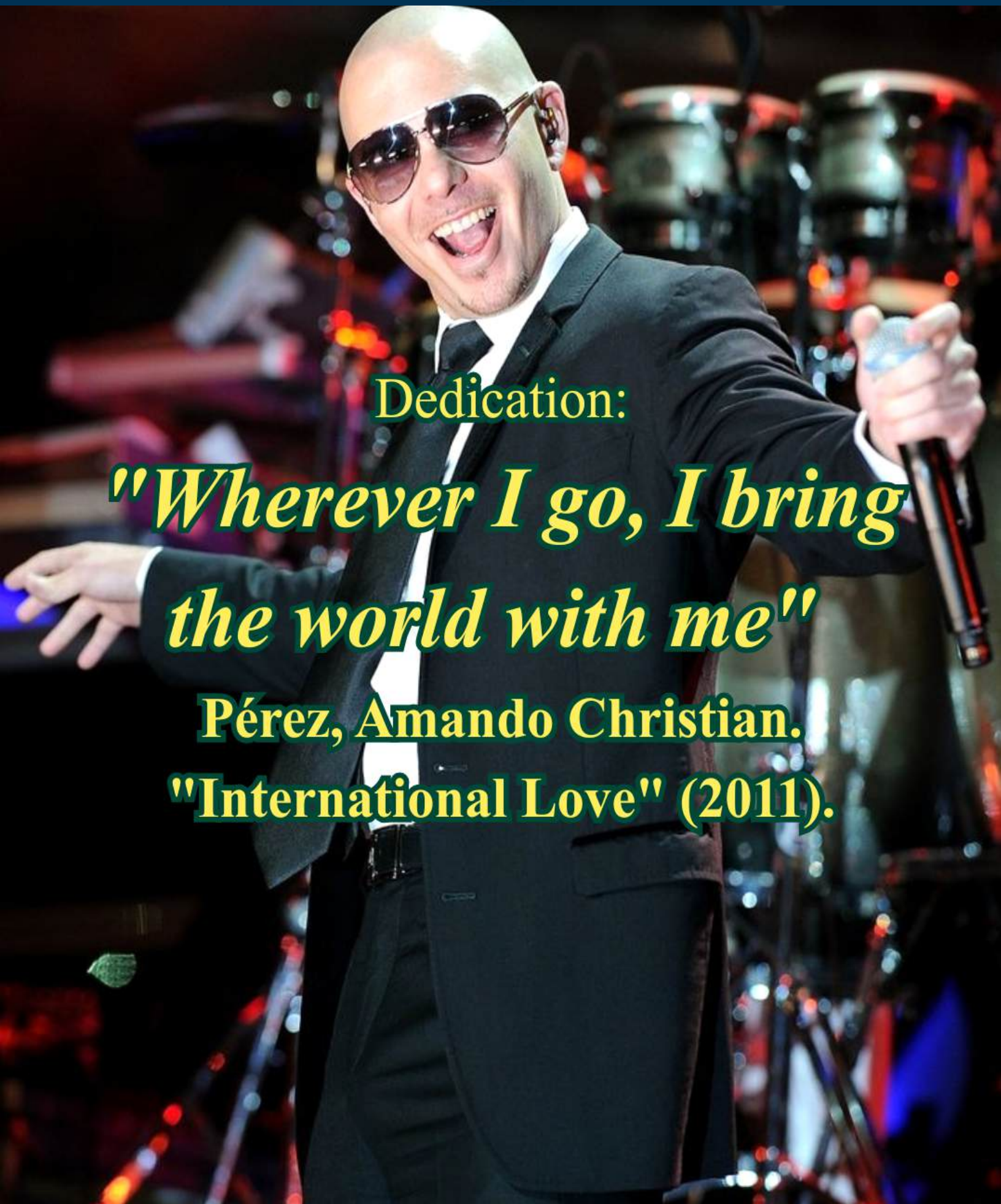

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## CLEAN ENERGY DEVELOPMENT & INDEPENDENCE

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### *Federal Energy Transition*

#### **1. The "Tax Form 305" Act (TFTOFA)**

The TFTOFA will boost individual and corporate participation in renewable energy by providing financial incentives towards the implementation of green energy technology and infrastructure.

This section will primarily work to encompass existing credit regulation, including the pre-existing 30% residential and commercial solar credit, and the varied rate production credit. Notably, this section will introduce a new credit specifically aimed at dealing with the surge of data centers by providing an additional 5%-10% scaled credit based upon kilowatts (kw) consumed from green energy power generation.

#### **2. The "Don't Stop the Party (Bus)" Act (DSTPBA)**

The DSTPBA addresses how transportation and infrastructure factor into fossil fuel dependence and accessibility of sustainable living. The DSTPBA will combat the monopolistic influence of oil in transportation by promoting measures that provide alternatives to individual gas car usage. This includes federal improvements to public transportation, promotion of walkable infrastructure, and fuel efficiency guidelines and mandates.

The DSTPBA will aim to both expand upon the accessibility of current public transport and spearhead new programs. This will function to support public transit initiatives without furthering usage of fossil fuels. Additionally, \$130,000,000 will be allocated over a 5 year period to aid in maintaining local reduced-fare programs, removing potential financial hurdles preventing citizens from utilizing public transit.

The DSTPBA focuses on promoting the purchase and usage of electric and fuel efficient cars and trucks. Primarily, the DSTPBA will strengthen the mandated fuel economy goal to 54.2 MPG by 2031, reducing emissions without inconveniencing consumers. To encourage corporate compliance, a fine of \$167.50 per vehicle will be charged to corporations who are found to have allowed the sale of non-compliant vehicles. As for electric vehicles, the DSTPBA will expand the potential electric vehicle tax credit to \$8,500 for new vehicles and \$6,500 for used vehicles. This will provide a financial incentive while simultaneously encouraging consumers towards used vehicles, an important nudge away from new EVs considering the potentially unethical production line of lithium-ion batteries.

#### **3. The "Money is Still a Major Issue" Act (MSMIA)**



MSMIA marks federal recognition towards the importance of research and research institutions in navigating the transition towards green energy. MSMIA will work to secure stable and consistent federal funding for climate research, both by reserving space in the federal budget to accommodate academic funding, and optimizing the processes by which funding is acquired, such as the application process for federal grants. Finally, the act will work to diminish any influence of the oil lobby in the sphere of green energy research.

The MSMIA will include increased funding to the following organizations: The NSF, NASA, the NIH, the DOE, and the NIST. It is assumed that with further funding of these entities, further funding and grants will be able to be levied towards a wider array of green energy research projects.

#### **4. The "Give Me Everything Tonight" Act (GMETA)**

The GMETA will fight to reduce the influence of capital interests while maintaining a strong domestic energy industry. This goal will be accomplished through a wide array of measures: carbon taxes and fines, stronger enforcement of anti-monopoly legislation, and gradual restrictions on fracking and offshore drilling.

The GMETA will work to stifle corporate carbon emissions by implementing additional taxes and fines scaled on the amount of carbon emitted by a corporation. Carbon taxes will be implemented over a 6 year period, beginning at a rate of \$13.42 per ton of CO<sub>2</sub>, increasing consistently each year to a final rate of \$80.52 per ton of CO<sub>2</sub> by 2032. In order to prevent individual companies from significantly contributing to global emissions, companies operating within the U.S. will be ordered to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions by 35% by 2032. Companies unable to meet this goal will be fined \$17.50 per ton of CO<sub>2</sub> emitted over the reduced emission goal.

For fracking, a total ban will be enacted gradually over a 10 year period. To begin, states will be required to have decreased the amount of active wells in 2026 by 30% by 2029. A numerical limit of 135 wells per state will be required in 2032, decreased to 85 in 2034. Finally, in 2036 the practice of fracking will be outlawed on a federal level. As for offshore drilling, the act will maintain the banned territories set by the Biden Administration such in the East and West coasts.

### ***Renewable Energy and Clean Grid Strategies***

Solar panels and other renewable technology will be made affordable for American households and businesses without putting burden on the American people by redirecting existing taxes. The plan uses the \$138 billion collected yearly in fossil fuel taxes and saves \$35 billion by ending fossil fuel subsidies to fund its two main grants. Over a decade, this funding would help about a quarter of American households receive up to \$6000 for installing renewable technology. The policy also stops new coal, gas, and oil drilling on federal lands.



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## ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION STANDARDS FOR NATIONAL PARKS

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Party Worldwide intends to propose a set of policies that will guarantee consistent funds for the National Parks.

Party Worldwide will require national parks to supply land for private concessionaires in total at least 0.3% of the total acreage, encouraging financial sustainability. Parks may apply to provide less than the set limit, depending on circumstances regarding security and biodiversity. Each acre of land supplied for concession will be sold for 20% more than the local market price, encouraging necessary economic development in hospitality and entertainment.

Party Worldwide will decrease the standard franchise fee for national park hospitality concessionaires. All fees which were previously set by national parks will be decreased to 5-10% of the concessionaire's revenue. Parks that fail to decrease their fee will be required to pay the difference from the average 8% in sales tax. Concessionaires that fail to pay the set fee to the national park will be subject to fines double the amount they failed to pay.

The plan will rely on the investments and actions of private businesses. Private businesses must follow environmental regulations that guard against excessive vegetation destruction, toxic waste, unnecessary wildlife disruptions, air/water pollution, and unsustainable building materials. In the case that these businesses violate any regulations, they can be subject to minimum fines of \$2,000 per offence.

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## AI REGULATION IN ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE

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Party Worldwide promotes economic productivity and the centralization of the U.S. government through efforts to decrease artificial intelligence's environmental impact.

The National AI Inspector Corps will be created to regulate AI systems across the country. Inspectors will be stationed at major data centers and high-emission industrial AI hubs to ensure compliance with environmental regulations. The Corps will possess the authority to halt operations of AI systems or databases that violate federal standards. The annual budget to maintain the National AI Inspector Corps is \$971.8 million. Companies that refuse to cooperate with inspection processes or do not meet compliance benchmarks will be subject to suspension of operations and imposition of a monetary fine at a minimum of \$50,000. To initiate cleaner,



more efficient methods of water consumption, federally approved closed-loop water recycling systems will be implemented in existing AI data centers. This will require \$1 billion to be allocated for constructing national infrastructure.

Party Worldwide proposes a transition in AI detection technologies into state ownership, reducing corporate control over essential AI-powered monitoring systems. Satellite analysis tools, emission scanning algorithms, and chemical anomaly detectors will become state-owned assets. Private companies will be compensated for federal usage of AI systems. In total, \$9 billion will be used for compensation. Private corporations that continue using AI systems will be required to pay an annual “Sustainable AI Usage” fee based upon the amount of energy the companies’ AI computations employ. The revenue earned from the fee will be used to fund federal AI development and nationalized infrastructure, authorizing full transparency of energy procurement and methodology.

The estimated cost for the U.S. to decrease environmental impact and increase economic productivity would be \$20 billion over a 10-year period, with time allotted for adjustments to ensure success and smooth operations.

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## NATIONAL CLIMATE RESILIENCE & DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

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The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will strengthen its 10 regional sections and assist in the implementation of Party Worldwide’s policies to maintain the socio-economic status and counter economic and natural disasters.

The Top Fortune 500 businesses will be incorporated as “partners” with the U.S. Government for preparation and restoration during an economic crisis. These businesses would be setting aside a certain percentage of their earnings towards disaster preparedness and aiding the affected communities. Partners that opt-in to the partnership will receive financial incentives in lower corporate taxes and increased subsidies.

Party Worldwide proposes to increase the quality and quantity of sensory technology used to track and warn people about upcoming natural disasters. FEMA will be in charge of the technology and the logistics behind this distribution of information. This will cost the U.S. Government an estimated \$35 billion.

Individuals would be incentivized to buy quality insurance packages based on their location and prevalent natural disasters. The packages offered by insurance companies are required to have multiple packages for varying income levels that will be updated every 3 years. The package prices will not increase, making the purchase affordable for working class families.

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## GOVERNMENT INTEGRITY & ANTI-CORRUPTION

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Party Worldwide will weed out corruption by banning congressional members and executive officers from owning stocks and mandating stricter monitoring for government employees.

### 1. “Lock the Stock” Act

Government employees cannot hold any stocks for all their personal portfolios. Any other securities such as bonds will not be included with the ban. A violation of this ban will induce a minimum \$15,000 fine and any profit received from the stock market will be seized.

The monitoring of government employees will be handled by the Office of Government Ethics, an already established agency. The cost of continuing to run the Office of Government Ethics will be \$23 million.

### 2. “Federal Recall” Act

This act will allow congressional members to be recalled by their specific state or district. If 25% of voters in the previous election signatures are collected within the district the member represents, a recall election will be held. This election can only be held between two weeks into office and two months before reelection.

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## CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM

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Party Worldwide will ban the use of the death penalty across the United States. Party Worldwide will protect the right for the criminally accused to be given the right to a speedy trial, due process, legal counsel, trial by jury and the legal presumption of innocence until proven guilty.

Party Worldwide will create the Mister Worldwide to Infinity Program, ensuring justice for victims of a crime. Criminals will be forced through court-ordered restitution to pay back for the damage they may have caused including property loss, medical costs, pain and suffering.

Laws prohibiting the national sale of alcohol, gambling, and sex work at the age of 21 and up will be repealed. Laws prohibiting the national production and sale of marijuana will also be repealed. Marijuana will be decriminalized and legalized for users 18 and up. Current citizens in jail or prison for marijuana use will be immediately placed on parole.



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## HUMAN TRAFFICKING

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Party Worldwide will propose a set of policies that focuses on effective strategies for anti-trafficking enforcement and victim protection systems. Such policies are composed of three main parts that will increase anti-trafficking enforcement and support for victims.

Party Worldwide will ensure that children under the age of 18 are not exposed to human-trafficking by requiring age verification for social media accounts. In addition to age verification, this act will also address the growing use of AI profiles. There has been a trend of AI-generated technology used in faking photos, changing voices, and other forms of manipulation exploiting children and adults. The federal government will flag and monitor any suspicious activity occurring on social media platforms, including unmarked AI accounts. Stricter regulations on media and increased techniques to catch traffickers will decrease the numbers of minors who are being sold into trafficking in the United States.

Party Worldwide will increase the amount of resources that are available to victims of human-trafficking and ensure that each victim is treated equally, including domestic sex workers looking for safety. All levels of government will work to transfer these individuals to federally managed locations that provide long term stabilization. These locations will provide the essentials of housing, food, water, transportation, childcare, and job assistance for up to two years, after which the government will partner with private charities to establish further housing. For any of the victim survivors that are not a U.S citizen, the government will be guaranteed a temporary protection status that will ensure that they will not face deportation.

This plan will cost around \$9 million to cover new federal resource centers, expand border enforcement, and create a federal online safety system. The annual budget to keep these programs going will be roughly around \$3.5 million.

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## GUN POLICY

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Party Worldwide will propose a set of legislation that will protect Americans and their 2nd Amendment right to bear arms. The shift in policy will happen in three sequential steps that together will be known as the “Molon Labe” Plan.

- 1. “The Freedom of Ownership” Act**



Party Worldwide will nationally legalize and tax the manufacture, sale, and possession of approved Class III weapons as long as the dealer, manufacturer, and purchaser have all passed the required checks to do so legally.

Firearm manufacturers that sell more than 1500 firearms or 2000 parts per year will be taxed \$100,000 annually. For firearms manufacturers who sell less than the previously stated number of guns or parts, the tax will be \$6000 annually. For dealers who employ more than 100 persons, the tax will be \$10,000 annually, and for dealers who employ 100 people or less the tax will be \$1000 annually. Additional sales tax of \$100 will be implemented on every gun sold within the United States. These funds will in part be used to fund enforcement efforts to regulate illegal purchases of firearms and enforce alternative community safety plans.

## **2. “Ghost-Gun-Busters” Act**

The plan will ban the manufacture, sale, and possession of plastic firearms and parts that can modify a weapon into a machine gun or explosive device, effective immediately. The act will also ban the manufacture, sale, and possession of any firearm without a federally recognized serial number. These policies once implemented will serve to fully incriminate the untrackable “ghost guns” by requiring manufacturers to immediately cease creation of plastic firearms parts, while dealers and citizens who own a “ghost gun” will be given a full year to submit their weapons or parts to a Federal Bureau of Investigation or Bureau of Alcohol and Tobacco field office. The weapons will either be confiscated or be sent away to be engraved with a federally recognized serial number and promptly returned to the owner at a fee of \$60. Those found in violation of this act will be punished by a fine not less than \$1,000, and jail time at a minimum of 1.5 years years in length depending on severity of offense.

Instating the “National Firearms Owner Database” will cost an estimated \$678 million and an additional \$508 million annually after the first year. These costs will also be absorbed by the revenue gained in the “Freedom of Ownership” Act. Additionally, the ATF will be given \$700 million annually to carry out their new duties, raising their budget by 43%. The remaining revenue from the “Freedom of Ownership” Act, roughly \$160 million, will be made available to local law enforcement agencies as grants administered by the Department of Homeland Security and used to cover costs to manage serialization applications and the storage of submitted weapons.

## **3. The “Registration and Enforcement” Act**

The third and final policy that will be proposed in the “Molon Labe” Plan will ensure that law enforcement have the necessary power to stop irresponsible gun owners from using their weapons to harm innocent people. This act requires that all people who possess any firearm other than a musket, or who live on a property where any firearm other than a musket is stored, are required to file with the federal government their names, addresses, social security numbers, the type of weapon in their possession or on their property, and fingerprints. All this information will



be filed under a new government database known as the “National Firearms Owner Database” and will be accessible by any local, state, or federal law enforcement officer. Additionally this act will require that any person when purchasing a firearm other than a musket to sign a form that will read as follows:

*I recognize that the firearm that I am purchasing is regulated by the “Registration and Enforcement” Act and I have already complied with submitting my information to the “National Firearms Owner Database”.*

*Signature \_\_\_\_\_ Date \_\_\_\_\_*

This will allow for the swift neutralization of any persons who may potentially do harm to the public, and save many American lives.

The “Freedom of Ownership” Act is the primary money maker in the “Molon Labe” Plan. With the income that is provided by the new tax proposals the government will generate an estimated \$3,768,000 from pistol manufacturing in Arizona<sup>1</sup> alone. The additional revenues from dealers and other firearms manufacturers in all states and territories will yield a revenue much greater. This is the money that will be used to pay for the “Registration and Enforcement” Act’s implementation of the “National Firearms Owner Database” which will have an estimated initial start up fee of \$678,881,450 and an annual operating cost of roughly \$508,223,450 after that<sup>2</sup>. All other costs associated with the “Molon Labe” Plan are self paying.

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## GUN VIOLENCE REDUCTION & SAFETY REFORM

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Party Worldwide will build on the legalized gun trade by ensuring regulations on keeping unfit and dangerous individuals from purchasing weapons. Party Worldwide will employ a 10-day waiting period and red flag laws.

### **1. Red Flag Laws**

Building on the "Registration and Enforcement" Act, the firearm customer will agree to forfeit their firearms to local law enforcement if they are deemed to be in a crisis that can cause harm to themselves or others.

To be deemed “in a crisis”, a household member or a police officer must petition a court for the temporary removal of their firearms until they are properly assessed, and confirmed to be in a safe situation to possess their firearms.

## **2. 10-Day Waiting Period**

Prior to receiving a purchased gun, a mandatory 10-day waiting period must be completed. This will ensure that those undergoing a mental crisis will have the opportunity to seek mental and physical help, before they have the opportunity to harm themselves or others.

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## THE OPIOID & FENTANYL CRISIS

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Party Worldwide’s “Addiction and Awareness Initiative” aims to create a community where those suffering from drug addiction can get the help they need.

### 1. “The Drugs, Addiction, and Recovery” Act

Party Worldwide strives to expand access to reputable drug treatment programs. Previously, rehabilitation centers received funding through the State Opioid Response Program, in which the states decide where the funding goes. However, to ensure the reliability and success of these rehabilitation centers, the federal government will now be more directly involved in the distribution of funds. In each state, the federal government will fund rehabilitation centers that meet standards set by a committee of experts on addiction and healthcare.

To fund the initial creation of 50 rehabilitation centers in each state, Party Worldwide will allocate \$6 billion in the first year.

### 2. “The Awareness, Advertising, and Restrictions” Act

Today, advertisements for pharmaceutical products appear everywhere. These advertisements continually push the usage of certain drugs, regardless and barely addressing the long list of side effects. Party Worldwide will not allow this to continue. Under the “Awareness, Advertising, and Restrictions Act”, pharmaceutical advertising will only be allowed if the drug does not have the potential to be highly addictive.

Whether or not a drug is classified as highly addictive will be determined by the Drug Enforcement Administration and the National Institutes of Health. Along with this, Party Worldwide will lead an awareness campaign on the dangers of drug addiction and on resources for those struggling with drug addiction. This information will be broadcasted across television, social media, radio, and streaming services.

Creating and running awareness campaigns will cost \$101 million, which will be spent across available advertisement sites.

### 3. “The Community Above All” Act

Party Worldwide wants to enrich community centers so no one is left to suffer in silence. Community centers will not only give people free access to resources on drugs and drug addiction, but also keep stocked Narcan, a substance that can reverse an opioid overdose.



These community centers will be created in each city and be both state and community funded, with the goal of creating numerous self-sustaining community centers that provide support through issues of drug abuse.

This act will also create a national crisis hotline for people who have desires to abuse drugs, fear that they are in a situation where they may turn to drugs, or are actively consuming drugs. This hotline will be run by paid professionals on addiction and counseling and qualified volunteers.

Restocking Narcan and maintaining the national crisis hotline will cost a total of \$820 million annually.

#### **4. “The Legalization, Regulation, and Taxation” Act**

Party Worldwide will decriminalize and legalize marijuana on the federal level by declassifying marijuana as a schedule I drug and removing it from the Controlled Substances Act. Anyone currently incarcerated for marijuana possession, selling marijuana to others, or petty drug crimes will be subject to immediate parole hearings for the possibility of release. This will allow the federal government to regulate the marijuana industry under drug-addiction-limiting guidelines such as requiring marijuana shops to provide information on drug addiction and how to get help with every purchase.

The federal government will place an excise tax on the marijuana industry. Like the alcohol excise tax, this tax is high enough to reduce substances, but low enough to prevent people from entering the illegal drug market. For the first year of implementation, the excise tax will be set at 18%, and slowly increase to 20% in subsequent years if not causing an increase in the illegal drug market.

Funding for the first three acts will mainly come from the excise tax on the marijuana industry. As of 2024, the marijuana industry made \$30.1 billion in revenue. This means that if the marijuana industry were to stay steady, the excise tax would produce \$5.4 billion per year. Thus, the cost of “Addiction and Awareness Initiative” in its entirety will reduce to \$1.5 billion.

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## **ABORTION & CHILDCARE**

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The limitation of abortion by the United States is a direct limitation of the U.S citizens' healthcare. Party Worldwide calls for the expansion of Planned Parenthood to increase access to reproductive health and abortion. We demand the building of new clinics and new job openings that also stimulate the economy.

#### **1. Planned Parenthood Act**



Party Worldwide will propose a policy that reinstates Roe V. Wade. All states will have to provide abortions up until 22 weeks. After 22 weeks, the legality of abortions will be determined by the states unless the circumstances involve incest or rape, or threaten the health of the mother.

As of 2025, there are around 600 planned parenthood clinics. Party Worldwide will build another 300 Planned Parenthood clinics around the country. For the preexisting 600 locations, \$134 million are being spent annually. This act will contribute another \$67 million to support the opening of the new locations. The building of new clinics is estimated to be around \$1.2 billion.

## **2. Contraceptives Act**

The government will fund necessary contraceptives such as barrier contraceptives, vasectomies, and tubal ligation with up to \$3.85 billion.

## **3. Childcare and Adoption Accessibility Act**

Accounting for the current amount of low income Americans with children, the US will spend about \$60 billion per year to increase childcare programs and lower income based barriers. Working class families that make less \$70,750 will receive reduced costs on childcare. Party Worldwide will continue to spend around \$5 billion to maintain the foster adoption program free of cost to promote adoptions.

We will spend \$6 million to increase education on reproductive health nationwide, further prioritizing an increase in accessibility or all.

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# **MEDICARE & MEDICAID**

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As of today, Medicare is hurt by inefficiency: wasteful resource allocations, predatory drug costs, and giant amounts of paperwork in outdated systems that fail to prioritize enrollees. Party Worldwide will implement a set of policies to reduce wasteful spending and optimize care processes, and provide higher quality of care to enrollees across the board. The legislative plan contains three major initiatives, planned to be implemented together. The collection will be known as the "Everyday Above Ground Health Reset" plan.

## **1. The "Medicare Reduction Remix" Act**

This addresses the inefficient allocation of resources for the medicare program. It would eliminate Medicare Advantage plans, which are a high cost to the federal government compared to Traditional Medicare. Those previously enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan would be automatically enrolled in Traditional Medicare, reducing wasteful spending and inefficient healthcare coverage.



## **2. The “Planet Pit Deal” Act**

The second policy in this plan addresses predatory drug costs, implementing a Most Favored Nation (MFN) plan, forcing pharmaceutical companies to price similarly to that of other wealthy nations. In the United States, the cost of insulin is \$98.70, the most expensive in the world, as opposed to Canada \$12. This plan would be implemented through a series of executive orders and price caps. Together, this will dramatically lower costs for consumers and the federal government, as well as prioritize a focus on crucial medications like insulin, chemotherapy, and GLP-1s, advised by data on the current least-accessible drugs.

## **3. The “Paperwork Party’s Over” Act**

Party Worldwide will standardize complex and inefficient billing procedures, and penalize companies that don't participate, such as fines per quarter out-of-date. Hospitals are hurt by outdated hospital systems and redundant administration. To combat this, grants will be provided to update and streamline the cost of these tasks, saving billions annually.

The Everyday Above Ground Health Reset plan has the potential to save upwards of \$119.6 billion per year. This set of policies clearly fulfills Party Worldwide’s commitment to market efficiency: preserving competition where it functions, intervening when it fails, and using government authority to eliminate waste, realign incentives, and ensure that taxpayer dollars are spent efficiently.



**CHAPTER FOUR**  
**Domestic Economy**

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## TAX CODE MODERNIZATION

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America is hurt by increasing unequal concentrations of wealth, strategies by corporations to avoid taxation, and the power of unchecked digital assets. Party Worldwide will create an effective tax code that addresses these issues, prioritizing and ensuring the common good.

### 1. “Tell ‘Em Hey! Tax Equity” Act

Under this proposal, the tax rate on the highest income bracket of \$640,000+ will increase by around 50%. This act will also ensure that investment income and wages are taxed more for very high income households, reducing the gap between how capital and labor are treated. This will generate an estimate of \$200-250 billion in additional annual revenue, without affecting middle-class taxpayers.

### 2. “You Better Dance for Profit Responsibility” Act

Major corporations will also be required to publicly and transparently disclose their sources of income. To ensure companies cannot reduce their effective tax rates to nothing through legal loopholes, Party Worldwide will create a minimum 20% tax rate on the profits that corporations publicly report to investors. To combat “tax havens” like the Canaries and Virgin Islands, when company profits are moved to a lower tax country, the company will be forced to pay the difference to the United States. Enforcement for this policy will be accomplished through cooperation between the Treasury Department and the IRS, backed by penalty structures for corporations that misreport profits. This 20% minimum will generate an additional \$120 billion in annual tax revenue.

### 3. “Digital Fairness” Act

Digital asset companies will be required to report transactions to the IRS in the same way that banks and payment platforms already do. This will close major loopholes and ensure compliance in an area where there is not much enforcement. Similarly, a financial tax of around 0.1% will be imposed on the sale of stocks, bonds and derivatives. This tax will restrain the volume of high frequency trading that generates huge volumes of untaxed transactions. Retirement accounts are exempt from this tax. An estimate of \$70-80 billion in annual revenue will be generated from this policy.

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## MINIMUM WAGE

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Party Worldwide will ensure every worker's success and right to economic opportunity, so that American families and households can finally get ahead of increasing costs.

### 1. "Right-To-Union Laws" Act

Some states have right-to-work laws that allow employees to choose whether or not to join a union and avoid paying dues without risking their jobs. However, many states still don't have right-to-work laws, and force workers into a union system they do not feel best placed in. Union leaders in these states can fire workers who refuse to pay union dues. Party Worldwide aims to implement right-to-work laws in every state to protect anyone from being forced to pay money to a union they might oppose in order to make a living.

Party Worldwide will use the rise in corporate taxes from increased economic growth to continue funding no taxes on tips, no taxes on overtime, and decreased payroll taxes for young workers in entry-level jobs, making sure those who are in search of hard work and success will find it.

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## AFFORDABLE HOUSING

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Party Worldwide will work to provide more public housing for all.

### 1. "Building Homes" Act

Party Worldwide will aim to build 0.3 homes for every home needed each year. This plan will also limit zoning regulations, allowing the building of new houses in areas suffering from the greatest shortage. This policy is projected to build around 1.1 million houses in the U.S. per year.

### 2. The "Housing First" Act

Party Worldwide will expand the income range for people to be eligible to apply for public housing. This policy allows any individual or family whose household spending is more than 30% of their total income to apply for public housing, giving people with lower incomes more priority. They will be able to pay a price or rent that adds up to less than or equal to 30% of their income, allowing for individual plans.

### 3. The "Rent and Retirement" Act

This policy will aim to build around 40,000 retirement homes per year in the first 10 years. The other part of this policy leaves it up to states to set a market appropriate cap on rent for working



families. However, it also sets a maximum of \$100 per square foot instead of the median listing price of \$224 that a state could cap it at.

This is estimated to cost the government around 300 billion a year due to the 1.1 million housing units and the 40,000 retirement homes being built per year. With private public partnerships the average cost of a house comes out to around \$250,000 and each retirement home costs around \$317,000.

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## SNAP BENEFITS & FOOD SECURITY

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We are in a “dependency-crisis”: SNAP, despite its cost of more than \$100 billion a year, has failed to solve the underlying issues of poverty, barely managing them. SNAP benefits enable workers to quit their jobs or stop seeking employment.

The program plays an important role in supporting those most in need, but its effectiveness is ruined by numerous counts of exploitation and abuse.

### 1. **The “Secure Benefits, Secure Nation” Act**

This act will mandate an immediate technological overhaul of the Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) system across all administering states. All current outdated magnetic EBT cards must be replaced with new EMV (Europay, Mastercard, and Visa) chip technology.

### 2. **The “Able-bodied” Act**

This legislation will abolish all state waivers for work requirements for Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs), mandating strict compliance with minimum work, job training, or community service hours as a prerequisite for receiving benefits. The goal is to efficiently narrow the path for any dependency and encourage SNAP recipients to seek economic self-sufficiency.

### 3. **The “Corporate Accountability and State Budget” Act**

To make the market fairer, Party Worldwide will create a Corporate Subsidy Tax. This tax makes large, profitable companies pay money back to the government based on how many of their full-time workers still need SNAP benefits. This forces corporations to make a choice, either they must pay their workers more so they no longer need welfare, or they must reimburse taxpayers for the money spent covering their workers' food costs.

### 4. **The “Zero-Leak” Act**



To prevent cuts during state emergencies, recessions, disasters, etc., this act requires states to spend a minimum amount on food assistance, calculated using their past spending. This ensures predictable help and protects vulnerable citizens from sudden aid cuts due to unpredictable events.

For a program that cost over \$93.7 billion in FY 2024, a projected 5% reduction in non-crisis cases in the first year is estimated to save over \$4.6 billion per year.

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## LGBTQIA+ PROTECTIONS

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Party Worldwide will develop a plan that ensures everyone has equal opportunity and safety in the workplace. There are four initiatives that will be proposed under the “The Full Spectrum Protection” Plan. These acts when fully utilized will benefit our domestic economy by promoting diversity, creativity, and economic growth within the office.

### 1. “Hands Off My Desk” Act

This act advances existing protections in the office by enforcing strict zero tolerance policies and consequences. With a zero tolerance policy for discrimination, employers can not discriminate by withholding promotions, prevent the hiring of an LGBTQ+ individual, or fire an LGBTQ+ individual, without sufficient evidence that it is due to how they work rather than how they identify, or otherwise harass an employee in an office space because of their own beliefs.

### 2. “VAWA Expansion”

This act will expand upon the protections provided by the Violence Against Women Act. With this act, women, children, as well as transgender and other gender nonconforming people, will all be included in the Violence Against Women Act, making stalking against these groups a crime in every state, funding community solutions to intimate partner violence, and funding multiple more protection and safety programs. This act also provides funding for lawyers, ensuring a victim has all the resources needed to feel secure for their next steps.

### 3. “Safe Streets” Act

In this act, the number of government-funded LGBTQ+ shelters across the 50 states will rise substantially. These shelters will be known as “Safe Space Shelters” and will provide resources to LGBTQ+ youth ages 10 to 19 experiencing homelessness that will help them in the long-run. These resources include shelter, clothing, counselors, food, and other necessities.

“The Full Spectrum Protection” Plan is estimated to cost the government roughly \$25 billion a year.



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## AI IN THE WORKFORCE

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Artificial Intelligence (AI) serves as a flashpoint issue in today's economy. Party Worldwide plans on addressing this issue through the "AI Control and Research" plan. Through the plan, we will focus on the limits allowed on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and the funding towards understanding and management of the AI systems.

### **1. The "3 to 12" Act**

Party Worldwide will implement federal guidelines of maximums and minimums of AI use in the job sectors. This would incorporate a 3 to 12 percent range for states to use and pick a percentage between the two. Companies will be allowed to incorporate AI not forced to only to the percent productivity of the workforce that the state has required.

### **2. The Mandation of Protection Act**

This act will implement mandatory screenings of jobs and firms to regulate the way that artificial intelligence is impacting the company. Through the Federal Trade Commission, artificial intelligence implementation will be monitored through random checks that are required every 1 to 2 years. If these firms or companies are found to be breaking the limits governed by the state, a fine will be placed. Fine prices can vary depending on the severity caused and what seems fit as an appropriate amount. If the company is found to be non-beneficial or impacting workers in a negative way, a stricter fine will be imposed on that company.

### **3. The Researchable Funding Act**

Through government aid to the National Science Foundation (NSF), more funding for the research of AI will be provided. The aid will start at \$100 million of funding every year for 5 years and then re-evaluate to raise or decrease this aid after 5 years. Party Worldwide wants to understand the impact that AI has on the United States labor force and how AI can ultimately aid or hurt the social wellbeing of the population. Using the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to monitor where the NSF is sending the money. The tracking of this funding will be monitored to confirm the reliability and the speed at which research is done. Around 50 to 75 percent of funding go towards the research and development of AI while the rest is used towards analysis of the current types of AI.

### **4. The Taxation Creation Act**

With a federal income tax increased by 0.25 percent, the estimated cost of these policies can be hit. The goal of funding is \$16.65 billion added to the Federal government's budget; with the



current income tax bringing in \$2.18 trillion yearly, the increase of \$16.65 billion allows the policies to stay funded and effective towards AI control. This goal will aid the increase of these agencies while trying to keep the cost lower; while also allowing states to afford and enact policies.

The cost analysis would be \$16.65 billion collected through an increase of tax to federal income, this will provide 325 million to each state and find the increase funding to NSF, FTC and OMB by 5%

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## FOOD SECTOR REGULATION

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Party Worldwide aims to help small farms by lowering their operational costs, avoiding legal uncertainty, and promoting innovation, while also helping consumers by decreasing the cost of food products and keeping them better informed. This will be done by reforming three regulations, Prop 65, the Food Modernization Act and labeling of GMOs.

### **1. Proposition 65 Repeal**

By reforming Proposition 65 to exclude the excessive labeling of carcinogens, consumers will no longer experience “warning fatigue.” Litigation would be shifted from the citizens to the U.S government avoiding unnecessary litigations that cost business money. Drug and alcohol labelings against carcinogens are not included in the removal of labeling proposed. Removing carcinogens from the water supply as per the Safe Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 would not be changed, either.

### **2. “From Farm to Table” Reform**

An overhaul of the Food Modernization Act of 2011 will give more power to small farms and reduce the cost of farming.

This will shift accountability to producers and increase competition in the market by keeping small farms profitable. Lowered regulation will not only lower compliance costs, but also the cost of liability insurance for consumers.

### **3. “Peel Back the Nonsense” Repeal**

To increase innovation and promote accurate science backed legislation, the labeling of GMO foods will no longer be required by manufacturers. The purpose of this is to increase innovation by encouraging the use of GMOs in food. This will also fight back against legislation that is not backed by research-driven evidence, and help increase the public's trust of the FDA to provide them necessary labeling.



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## SPORTS BETTING REGULATION

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Party Worldwide’s “Sports Gambling Freedom Protection Plan” will protect people’s rights to use betting applications responsibly and freely.

### 1. The “Freedom to Wager” Act

This act maintains the ruling of *Murphy v. NCAA* (2018), protecting a state’s right to decide if they wish for sports gambling to be legalized or not within its borders. This act will also create protections for sports betting under the 10th Amendment, reinforcing the Supreme Court’s decision to protect these freedoms.

### 2. The “Hands-Free” Act

Sports betting regulation will be left almost completely up to individual states, with the exception of maintaining the federal government’s minimum gambling age of 18, as well as the "Integrity in Sports and Gaming Program", which allows the FBI to ensure there is no fraud and/or rigged events within these institutions. This act also revises the Wire Act of 1961 to allow the transferring of betting information within any states who wish to legalize it, and to allow betting information transfers between the states which legalize it.

The “Sports Gambling Freedom Protection Plan” is estimated to cost the United States government around \$3 billion initially. However, revenue will be generated on a state level as opposed to a federal level. This program will encourage the legalization of sports gambling as a source for generating state revenue, which not only benefits the country’s economy, but also ensures personal freedom in the United States.

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## SOCIAL SECURITY REFORM

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The Personal Retirement Security and Solvency Act (PRSSA) proposes a transition from the current Social Security system to Personal Retirement Accounts (PRAs). The policy is built on three parts: solvency through ownership, beneficiary security reform, and transition protection through choice and property rights.

### 1. The “Ownership Advantage” Act

Solvency through ownership is for workers under 40 years of age. The payments meant for Social Security accounts will be directed into PRAs. These accounts will be managed by the owners within a regulated, competitive marketplace of verified low cost index funds like broad



based stock and bond funds. This prevents new participants from entering the old system and fixes the broken “pay as you” go system. This will be done by separating the Trust Fund from the old system. The proposed policy ensures that younger generations aren’t buying into a system that does not benefit them and saves money for the government.

## **2. The “Universal Benefit” Act**

The beneficiary security reform allows account holders to have their personal retirement account balances be passed down to heirs; this wasn’t present in the old system. At retirement, individuals either buy an annuity for a guaranteed income stream or follow a commissioned withdrawal schedule. The government’s role changes from providing benefits to maintaining market transparency, competition, and fraud prevention.

## **3. The “Stability in Transition” Act**

Citizens between the ages of 40 and 55 at the time of the act's passage will have the option of transitioning into the new personal retirement account system or staying with the current one. Workers under 40 will be automatically registered and those above the age of 55 will remain in the current system, receiving all their promised benefits.

This plan will take action in two years. In year one, the Personal Retirement Account Administration Corporation will be established; a small and independent federal corporation tasked with regulating/monitoring the approved fund marketplace. In year two, the personal retirement account platform would be launched. Payroll tax diversion begins at a rate of 2% percentage, increasing by 2 years every other year until the full 12.4% payroll tax is redirected. The old social security system would still benefit those using it. Payroll taxes and other low income state benefits fill the gap of the last recipients of Social Security. This era would require a period of federal borrowing to cover transitional costs but will be offset by massive savings caused by splitting the current Social Security Trust Fund and new PRA funds that would not flow into or be available in the trust fund. The Social Security Administration will change over a few years to a smaller organization with the goal of eradicating the old Social Security system to manage and maintain PRAs.

There are some transition costs but is mitigated by long term social security solvency and relying less on the government. Based on modeling from similar proposals, we estimate the need for approximately \$1-2 trillion in present value terms over multiple decades, but this is not new debt acquired from transition costs. It is from the effects of the old system estimated by the Social Security Trustees at \$22.4 trillion over the horizon. The new plan is estimated to save \$104.7 billion per year.



**CHAPTER FIVE**  
**Education**

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## AFFORDABLE FUTURES—POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

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Party Worldwide proposes a centralized, workforce-directed restructuring of federal higher education policy. This plan emphasizes disciplined oversight, efficiency, and accountability to ensure taxpayer dollars support fields essential to the national economy and security. The policy centers on tying federal loan eligibility to program value and workforce demand while requiring institutions to share financial responsibility for poor outcomes.

### 1. “Professionals have Standards” Act

Party Worldwide will establish a federal postsecondary standards board will be established. This national regulatory board will evaluate all academic programs receiving federal aid. Programs in engineering, computer science, healthcare, skilled trades, and K-12 education would qualify for the highest levels of support, due to their workforce importance. Program eligibility would be assessed using standardized federal metrics, including median earnings six years after graduation, completion rates and loan repayment outcomes disaggregated by income. Programs that fail to meet minimum thresholds for two consecutive review cycles would lose eligibility for federal student loans.

Institutions will be required to carry shared liability for federal student loans. Colleges would be required to reimburse a portion of defaulted loans when graduates from specific programs consistently fail to secure stable employment or repay debt. This corrects the current system in which taxpayers bear all financial risk while institutions face none, incentivizing colleges to improve advising, limit enrollment in low- return programs and prioritize work force fields.

### 2. “Foot toward the Future” Act

Party Worldwide will reorganize federal aid and would be reorganized into a Workforce Priority Loan System. Directing subsidized loans and grants toward high needed fields such as STEM, healthcare, and education. Students entering these fields would receive lower interest rates, expanded aid, and faster approval. This model mirrors existing federal approaches in defense, public safety, and research, where funding is closely aligned with national priorities.

Institutions receiving federal aid would be subject to limits on administrative spending and tuition growth. Colleges would be required to meet instructional spending ratios, publicly report workforce outcomes, and obtain federal approval for tuition increases exceeding inflation. These measures aim to reduce administrative bloat and unchecked tuition increases resulting from weak oversight.



Although implementation would require initial investment, long term savings are significant. Federal student loan defaults currently cost taxpayers approximately \$22 billion annually. By limiting aid to high-demand programs, and requiring institutional reimbursement for defaults, the Congressional Budget Office estimates federal higher education spending could decline by 10%-15% over the next decade, saving roughly \$100 billion. Because colleges already report outcome data through existing systems such as IPEDS and Title IV audits, the policy would not require the creation of a large new federal bureaucracy.

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## DEI & AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

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Party Worldwide will mandate that colleges and universities use a holistic review of students' achievements and socioeconomic obstacles, rather than relying on standardized test scores in university admission decisions. Party Worldwide will encourage universities to apply this holistic review by increasing research funding by \$5 million, ensuring that students from underserved communities that underperform on standardized tests are still considered for higher education.

### 1. The “Better Education” Act

Party Worldwide will fund Minority Group Recruitment Programs (MGRPs) in universities to increase the amount of students from underprivileged backgrounds able to pursue higher education. Collaborations with colleges and universities will help provide students with the resources they need for success in the college application process. Such resources will include SAT/ACT tutoring, subject-specific exposure (such as STEM or social sciences), and college application aid.

### 2. “Equality in the Workforce” Act

In order to end discrimination against minority groups, Party Worldwide will provide funding for corporations to invest in DEI programs. DEI programs must follow equity requirements through the creation of clear, specific goals for minority group representation in workplace roles, targeted minority group hiring practices, and employee DEI training. Targeted minority group hiring practices must include inclusive job descriptions, diverse interview panels, and outreach partnerships with minority organizations. DEI training will encompass unconscious bias education and workshops on inclusivity and cultural competency in a company's workplace environment. Party Worldwide will also double the Federal Trade Commission's budget to \$851.4 million to be able to investigate, audit, and break up corporations that do not meet such equity requirements.

The total investment in DEI programs in schools and corporations will cost the government around \$100 million.



**CHAPTER SIX**

**Infrastructure & Transportation Systems**

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## INFRASTRUCTURE & TRANSPORTATION MODERNIZATION

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Party Worldwide is dedicated to the repair and renovation of our country's infrastructure, not just for the sake of modernization, but for the safety of all Americans that depend on this infrastructure daily.

### **1. The “Hit The Gas Until We Lose Control” Program**

Many companies that produce the materials used for road construction, such as asphalt and concrete, are privately owned. To incentivize more publicly-owned companies, Party Worldwide will provide federal funds for worker-owned asphalt and concrete producing companies if they agree to repair highways across the nation. Companies that are not publicly owned can choose to become worker-owned and gain the same financial benefits. However, these companies will be subject to strict quality standards and monitoring by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and state departments of transportation. If companies choose not to abide by these guidelines, they will lose federal subsidies.

### **2. The “We Gotta Get It Right” Act**

Party Worldwide will address the lack of broadband infrastructure in certain areas of the country by granting tax credits to internet service providers if they agree to develop their infrastructure and services in rural and low-income neighborhoods. The use of fiber internet will be advised. Higher priority shall be placed on local and state level providers. Furthermore, these internet service providers are encouraged to offer vouchers to consumers in the area so that they can have affordable access to the internet.



**CHAPTER SEVEN**  
**Immigration**

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## VISA RETENTION & PATHWAYS TO PERMANENT RESIDENCY

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Immigrants still struggle with government neglect in immigration services, limited socioeconomic mobility, and an overly complex legal system. Party Worldwide will solve these issues with our Government for Immigrants Plan (GOI Plan).

### **1. The “Digitization of EOIR and USCIS Services” Act (DEUSA)**

Party Worldwide will reallocate \$4 billion towards simplifying government official jobs, optimizing organizational tools, and digitizing case management programs and services. The digitization process over the next year will involve:

- a) hiring additional adjudicators, immigration judges, and tech-savvy immigration officers, while annually laying off officers with negative reviews accumulated above a set threshold
- b) establishing real-time case-tracking software tools
- c) consolidating overly redundant forms, developing a user-friendly forums page for frequently-asked questions
- d) creating a hotline for free assistance with an immigration officer or public immigration attorney.

As this program progresses, Party Worldwide will commit to maintenance and updates of the online services every two weeks with dedicated federal software technicians on standby to ensure web crashes do not affect these significant services. This reallocation of resources will enable the government’s immigration services to operate with up to 30% higher efficiency.

### **2. The “Reformation of Immigrant Work Authorization” Act (RIWA Act)**

Party Worldwide advocates for a \$6 billion budget plan to reduce the cost of hiring immigrant workers for small businesses and to reform work authorization for VISA holders.

- a) The RIWA Act will dedicate \$3 billion to reducing employment sponsorship costs for small businesses and startups because they tend to prioritize low-experience workers. Reducing costs will increase favorability for hiring students fresh out of college, a key demographic of legal immigrants who struggle with finding jobs given the intense time limits before they’re deported due to lack of work, without the necessity of government mandates.



- b) Secondly, RIWA aims to expand work authorization rights listed under the OPT (Optional Practical Training) Program for VISAs like the F-1 and the H4, ensuring that young adults and teenagers (16 and above) have access to working rights so they can raise their family's economic mobility.

F-1 VISA-holding university students, a large demographic of legal non-resident immigrants, will be encouraged to enter into the labor force through internships, recruitment opportunities, and on-campus immigration support. This increases their social mobility and economic contributions at an early stage of immigration, incentivizing long-term stay.

H-4 VISA holders who tend to be dependents (spouses or children of work-authorized VISAs) also benefit from this expansive OPT program that lowers the age restriction on work as well as encourages job opportunities for these underrepresented people.

### **3. The “Reliable Residency Road” (RRR) Program**

Party Worldwide will invest \$2 billion to create a more streamlined, legal pathway for residency for incoming immigrants and those already in the U.S. holding temporary residential VISA statuses. Immigrants can attain residency within the next 5-7 years of stay given that they show demonstrated interest to stay longer and adhere to the legal pathway for residency.

By eliminating wait times, processing fees, and unnecessary official and legal requirements in the residency process, current and future immigrants on the waitlist will experience quicker appeal times and receive their well-deserved green card.

With a total budget of \$12 billion over the next 5 years, the GOI Plan ensures that all three programs work together to simplify the legal pathway, reform long-term stay benefits, and encourage legal immigration. Party Worldwide stretches support for both authorized and unauthorized immigrants, extending the American Dream to not only citizens and legal residents, but everyone who calls the United States home.

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## **UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS & PATHWAYS TO CITIZENSHIP**

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Party Worldwide plans to bring undocumented immigrants out of the shadows through a mandatory and protected nationwide registration program. The registration centers would ensure legal protections during the naturalization process, and issue a Unity Status Card, enabling access to work rights, healthcare, and state services. By offering immediate safeguards to undocumented immigrants through these Status Cards, this act strengthens labor markets and prevents under-the-table exploitations that depress the wages of these residents.



Party Worldwide will provide several new pathways to citizenship by centralizing federal authority, removing state-wide barriers, and adopting a national process to citizenship. This act aims to ensure that pathways are protected and federally provided rather than market-driven or privatized funding. The first proposed pathway grants Automatic Provisional National Residency (PNR) to any undocumented residents who can prove continuous residency for one year in the U.S. This proof could include employment records, school enrollment, or federal ID registration. After receiving PNR, citizens enter a five year program where if they maintain a clean record, and have proof of community and economic contribution are granted U.S citizenship. The second pathway to citizenship includes labor and workforce integration. Undocumented workers who have spent six months in the U.S qualify for the National Workforce Citizenship Track. Under this pathway, undocumented residents are assigned to job training programs, English education, and labor rights education. Upon a two-year program and verification of wage-theft-free employment history, residents will begin a three year expedited citizenship process. The final pathway introduced in this act will allow undocumented residents with familial relations already in the United States to obtain citizenship through the Family Unity Citizenship Track. This pathway removes barriers like filing fees, income requirements, and private attorneys. Upon enrollment, families will receive deportation protection, legal representation, and access to integration services. After three years of federally-monitored family stability, undocumented residents will receive permanent residency and immediate citizenship testing.

This act will allow automatic citizenship to undocumented residents that have proved their contribution to the U.S, but are overlooked in essential ways. Undocumented residents that have been victims of a crime, workplace abuses, or housing exploitations qualify for Citizenship by State Protection, shifting the burden off of residents and onto the government, affirming its role as a protector. Secondly, this act grants Citizenship by Federal Census Inclusion. Citizenship will be granted to undocumented residents who have been counted in two consecutive census cycles. These mechanisms allow the federal government to incorporate millions of undocumented immigrants through daily participation rather than restrictive paperwork.

This plan is estimated to cost the government \$35 billion for the first five years before shifting to a net positive fiscal impact by years 6-10. Providing a nationwide legalization program would boost wages, stabilize markets, and increase tax contributions, which is projected to increase the U.S GDP by 1.7 trillion over 10 years. Initial costs would be offset within 5-10 years as residents enter the workforce.

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## ROLE IN NATO

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### *Burden Sharing*

Party Worldwide will implement a policy that ensures the United States not only stays in NATO, but also gets the other members of NATO to spend more on defense.

#### **1. “Reduce Defense Spending” Act**

The United States will cut back from spending 3.38% of its GDP on defense to 2.7% at the start of the 2027 fiscal year. To account for this decrease in spending, Party Worldwide will decrease the amount of money spent on F-35 Joint Strike Fighters, halt the plan for the Sentinel program of new intercontinental ballistic missiles and instead focus on nationalizing the top ten defense companies that the Department of Defense currently pays far too much money to.

#### **2. “Nationalize Defense Companies” Act**

Party Worldwide will nationalize the top ten defense contractors (Lockheed Martin, RTX Corporations, General Dynamics, Boeing, Northrop Grumman, Huntington Ingalls, Humana, L3Harris Technologies, Leidos, and Cencora), assuming control over what is being produced to truly protect Americans' interests. This can be done under the Defense Production Act, which states that the President can take over certain industries in order to ensure that the country will be able to defend itself.

#### **3. “Withdraw Troops to Encourage the Increasing of Spending in NATO” Act**

Countries like Romania, Slovakia, Bulgaria, Slovenia, Croatia, and Hungary currently spend too little on NATO. Of those, Slovenia, Croatia, and Slovakia spend the least on defense and should be the most motivated to increase their spending. Pulling about three hundred troops combined out of those six countries will motivate them to rely on their own defenses. Party Worldwide will promise to reinstate the troops if it is clear that the countries are actively working to increase their defense spending. “Actively working to increase their defense spending” will be seen through either expanding airfields, funding more troops, doing more research, or contributing to NATO operations. This would make the financial burden-sharing of NATO more equal. Although this will not equal what the United States stopped spending, this increase in defense spending is a first step that will hopefully be replicated by other members of NATO.

The first policy saves the United States \$68.954 billion every year. The third policy would result in an additional \$25.627 billion spent on defense by members of NATO every year (assuming similar GDP). Additional money would be saved by the nationalization of US Defense contracts.



## *NATO Expansion*

The Peace in Our Time, Party All the Time plan addresses NATO's root causes for expansion while preventing risk of escalation of nuclear conflict, strengthening diplomatic relationships between member states and ensuring lasting peace and stability. By freezing new admissions until a review committee assesses strategic impact, a key flashpoint for Russia will be removed and billions will be saved in integration and logistics costs. Amending Article 5 to permit nuclear weapons only in retaliation after a nuclear attack will eliminate the possibility of a pre-emptive strike. Creating an annual rotating NATO gala, "The Worldwide Gala," will also strengthen cultural ties by deepening personal and cultural bonds among members that yield lasting diplomatic returns.

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## **ROLE IN THE UNITED NATIONS**

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### *Funding & Aid*

Party Worldwide will incorporate a dual funding policy with the United States allocating money from other agencies. This will provide an increased funding towards United Nations aid programs, though the funding will be monitored through monthly performance checks to which they can lose said funding. Party Worldwide believes in the support and aid to other countries, but doesn't want this funding to be abused.

#### **1. 2026 UN Funding Act**

This policy is aimed towards the federal budget and would reallocate funds towards the funding of aid programs within the UN, specifically their Office for the Coordination of Human Affairs. The increase would come from the previous budget of USAID, which has been discontinued. This is the first part of the ILP, in which the US will gain favor with other countries, strengthening their soft power.

#### **2. U.S Oversight Over Funding**

This policy establishes financial contribution rules for the UN which require the United States to link its funding to UN performance results through ongoing monthly performance assessments. The United States remains the UN's biggest financial contributor paying 22% of the regular budget and 26% of the peacekeeping expenses. The monthly benchmarks will ensure the budget is being used to maintain peacekeeping responsibility and reduce corruption. The benchmarks will trigger an automatic funding reduction if the organizations fail to meet their established



performance targets. The system operates through performance-based funding which drives administrative changes and allows the United States to determine fund allocation methods.

“We are One for American Aid campaign” is an increase in efforts and personnel for General Service Management and Office of Personnel Management. This increase is due to the misconceptions the public have about the spending of the US on international aid. The hope of this campaign is to encourage citizens to think of the support as an investment opportunity that will benefit both them as consumers and American businesses.

### *Military Involvement*

Party Worldwide is introducing new policy on the training and advancement to the United Nations military power. Through the “Feel this Moment: Strengthen UN Enforcement” we plan to create a strong and more efficient force to protect people and countries.

“Feel This Moment: Strengthen UN Enforcement” is a proposition that includes a quick reaction law enforcement team that will operate under UN peacekeeping forces. The United States will have the lead authority of this special task force mandating training and equipment provision. The UN peacekeeping forces currently operate without proper discipline, training, or defined rules for combat which have resulted in their unsuccessful missions. The purpose of this approach is to enable missions to take decisive action instead of watching violence unfold in front of them, stopping mass atrocities before they start.

The plan is estimated to cost around \$30 billion while the framework is set in the first 5-6 years. After the initial phase, costs are projected to stabilize when adjusted for inflation by creating a higher long-term funding baseline. Most of the funding will come from a cut USAID budget, with remaining funding going towards the We are One for American Aid campaign. The second part of the decade will be targeted towards the reform of the UN.

The “I Promise Tonight” Proposition requires \$13 billion annually, matching current U.S. budget levels meaning no additional overall spending. The U.S. will also push other countries to support the UN more. The “Reign Over Me” policy reduces spending because funding levels will depend on performance, meaning the reallocation of spending without losing any U.S. influence in the UN.

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## **TRADE & RELATIONS WITH CHINA**

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Party Worldwide will propose a set of policies that protect the prosperity of American workers, while ensuring the success of the United States economy. This plan focuses on lowering prices,



improving economic freedom, promoting innovative, competitive markets, and allowing individuals to determine where and how they engage in commerce and trade.

### **1. “US-China Tariff Repeal and Consumer Freedom” Act**

Party Worldwide will reduce all tariffs on consumer and intermediate goods from China to 3-5%. Tariffs and other costs that impact capital goods such as industrialized equipment and specialized machinery will be repealed over the course of 5 years. This gradual phase-out allows a smooth transition towards a more open and competitive market. Tariffs or restrictions may remain at high percentages on certain goods that threaten national security and the wellbeing of the American people, including semiconductors, technologies pertaining to military use, and highly advanced telecommunicative hardware.

### **2. “Executive Reform” Act**

Party Worldwide will restrict the Executive branch’s power to impose tariffs on international trade with China. Any tariff above the minimal threshold of 3-5% percent will require explicit congressional approval to be implemented. The proposed tariff must contain a cost-benefit analysis, estimates of consumer burdens, expected Gross domestic product impacts, and a justification for its implementation. The U.S. International Trade Commission and Department of Treasury will be required to publish an annual report detailing the total revenue collected from tariffs; the share paid by the United States, consumers, and producers; and the estimated costs on household per income level.

The net profit towards the American people would be around \$160 billion a year regained from purchasing power and efficiency. Furthermore, the United States Gross domestic product (GDP) could grow more than \$120 billion, representing an increase of 0.4% per year.

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## **STRENGTHENING DOMESTIC MANUFACTURING THROUGH FOREIGN TRADE & TARIFF INSTRUMENTS**

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Party Worldwide designed the “Time of Our Manufacturing” Plan to strengthen U.S. domestic manufacturing without solely relying on tariffs. Our plan will minimize waste, ensure measurable outcomes, and stimulate economic growth by lowering production costs and fighting against the shortage of skilled workers in the U.S.

### **1. The “Dale” of 2026 Initiative**



Party Worldwide will reduce the United States' reliance on tariffs by strengthening domestic manufacturing through automatic subsidies that offset high input and compliance costs. Subsidies will be based on measuring the performance of the domestic manufacturer such as their domestic production volume, capital investment, or workforce expansion. To become eligible for subsidies, companies must:

- a) Demonstrate new capital investment in U.S.-based facilities, equipment, or automation, such as in new technologies, machinery, or factory expansion
- b) Meet a minimum of 5% employment growth or provide real wage increases for manufacturing workers

Companies will also receive tax relief through accelerated depreciation, investment tax credits, and payroll tax reductions. This lowers the cost of capital and labor while allowing companies and industries to decide how to allocate resources based on demand.

## **2. The “Train the Night Away” Act**

Many industries in areas such as automation and robotics have a shortage of skilled workers, which slows production down, raises labor costs, and weakens the U.S. position in global trade. Party Worldwide will take on these issues by introducing the Workforce Training Tax Credit (WTTC). Eligible manufacturing companies can claim a 20-30% refundable tax credit on qualified training expenses such as apprenticeship programs, certification courses, safety training, and partnerships with community colleges.

Small companies with less than 25 full-time employees may qualify for a 30% refundable tax credit if they can maintain a 10% workforce participation in the program. For larger companies with 25 or more full-time employees to be eligible for the WTTC, they must maintain a minimum of 20% workforce participation in the training programs each year.

Overall, the act incentivizes companies to modernize their workforce, invest in new technology, increase production, and reduce the worker shortage.

The “Time of Our Manufacturing” is estimated to cost \$55 billion per year.

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## **TRANSNATIONAL NARCOTICS NETWORKS**

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Party Worldwide's International Love Plan protects individual liberties in controlled drug usage while eroding transnational criminal networks.

### **1. “Freedom Deployment Realignment” Initiative**



In the process of decriminalizing drugs, Party Worldwide will cease the use of lethal military strikes to regulate the international drug trade, reforming the SOUTHCOM counternarcotics operation and the deployment of U.S. Navy waterships to the Caribbean.

The U.S. Coast Guard will halt arrests regarding illicit drugs. The Drug Enforcement Agency and many other International Counternarcotics Activities will cease foreign Cooperative Investigations Programs, aviation and logistics, and drug and chemical controls.

Upon the dismantling and reformation of many of the past organizations related to counternarcotics, the government is projected to save up to \$20.5 billion annually.

## **2. “International Cooperative Anti-Smuggling (ICAS)” Treaty**

This section of the Room Service Tonight Action will expand on our bilateral cooperation with South American countries and Canada (USMCA) by fully establishing market-driven trade channels at official points of entry for the free flow of marijuana. To ensure that there is market transparency and the generation of tax revenue from the new markets, citizens will have to declare how many ounces of marijuana is in their possession.

Drug screenings will be mandated to seize illicit drugs; however, marijuana will be fully permitted across trade barriers. Screenings will still be conducted on marijuana products, ensuring they do not contain dangerous substances such as fentanyl, and allowing for data collection on the marijuana trade to monitor the effectiveness of the treaty. Failure to comply with screenings will result in a fine worth a minimum of \$3,000 per offense.

## **3. “The Antidote” Act**

The Antidote Act will reform the DEA, the Self-Management and Recovery Training (SMART), and other international counternarcotics initiatives to provide international offices with proper drug training so they can provide rehabilitation services for people suspected of drug use or drug smuggling. For those at the border of the United States, the act will expand on the ICAS treaty to cooperate with neighboring nations in providing their citizens with new opportunities. Said citizens, who may have been excluded from the workforce due to past drug history, will have the opportunity to work in the United States.

The Antidote Act is estimated to cost the government around \$25.1 billion annually, which will be fully compensated by a combination of reallocated spending and new streams of revenue.

The “Como Yo Le Doy” Plan introduces market-based streams of revenue through taxes on the free flow of marijuana. This, combined with the fact that individuals who were previously excluded from the workforce now have the opportunity to work and contribute taxable income ensures that the majority of the program is self-funded.



## GLOBAL HEALTH DIPLOMACY

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Party Worldwide plans to increase authority in our position in global health initiatives to prevent future pandemics. This is in reaction to the Covid-19 virus which was brought to question the United States' involvement in global health efforts.

### **1. The "Around the World Public Health" Act**

This involves the U.S. re-joining the World Health Organization (WHO) once again and persuading members that our task force is worth supporting. By doing research in the capital, the team will be able to locate potential threats and send the task force to that foreign country, working with medical professionals in that country to contain the disease. We seek to mitigate any illness that can go outside that country's borders by targeting it at the root. Any illness or disease that is not on the radar to become an epidemic or pandemic will not be focused on by this team, and these countries will be notified and warned about the aid that we plan to provide.

### **2. The "To Infinity Research" Program**

Party Worldwide will fund all medical equipment and global labs to observe where we can help. We want qualified experts to be the ones leading these teams. The selection process will be extensive, as well as only hiring medical professionals with at least 5 years of experience in their field. The government will also fund these research efforts, this program will raise sales tax by 0.5% across the nation for a period of 10 years. This percentage will be high enough to make revenue while still being low enough to cause inflation. Revenue from this tax will be used to fund the construction of the research center and allow the "One World Health Odyssey" to conduct research more readily and effectively across the globe.

### **3. The "Mr. Worldwide Health Care" Treaty**

Our partners will have to be notified and warned before health professionals come across their borders. This treaty will involve all countries that currently occupy seats in WHO, meaning we will have to meet in every regional office across the globe to sign off on this treaty. It will include allowing the U.S. full access to medical research sharing in every country and clearance for the team to enter every country who has agreed to the treaty on the basis of global public initiatives. Alongside that, we plan to provide full access to our medical supplies, labs and research findings when the team travels abroad.

This is estimated to cost the government roughly \$218.2 million over the span of ten years for construction, medical equipment and salaries of all the members of the task force.

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## U.S. RELATIONS WITH INDIGENOUS NATIONS

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Party Worldwide's Indigenous Gaming and Land Improvement Plan will improve current relations between the United States and indigenous nations with federal pullback and substantial investment into native-owned enterprises.

### 1. “The Casino and Economic Development” Act

The regulation of tribal gaming centers has been left to the state government under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act of 1988. This burdens tribes with strict bureaucratic procedures in getting casino creation passed, severely limiting revenue possibilities and infringing upon the right of tribes to build upon the land they own. Party Worldwide proposes federal and state government pullback in political control to allow tribes to exercise their sovereignty.

States and the federal government still maintain the right to regulate the construction of casino development in the case of an indisputable issue present in that land access.

### 2. The “305 to Miami Road” Act

Many tribal communities lack economic opportunity because of physical barriers caused by minimal transportation options. Party Worldwide's Tribal Transportation Self-Governance Program will grant more authority and funding to tribes over transit decision-making.

### 3. “Native Broadband Communication” Initiative

The job market is increasingly geared towards using technology in their operations. An estimated 22-24% of indigenous people do not have broadband access, and thus cannot pursue these opportunities. Party Worldwide seeks to remedy this by funding wideband implementation in tribal communities that most require assistance.

The BIA's annual budget of \$3.5 billion will be increased to \$4 billion to assist in indigenous sovereignty and improve native communities. A \$400 million investment in the Tribal Transportation Self-Governance Program and National Broadband Communication Initiative will go into effect for underdeveloped communities.

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## GLOBAL TRADE FRAMEWORKS & TARIFF ENFORCEMENT

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2025 marks the highest tariff rates since 1910 due to President Donald Trump imposing reciprocal and secondary tariffs under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act,



otherwise known as the IEEPA. Such tariffs are estimated to make the government roughly \$89 billion a year, but cost households \$1,100 a year. Party Worldwide argues for less executive power while maximizing individual power. With the Pitbull Worldwide Commerce Connection (PWCC), the power to impose tariffs will go to Congress as the Constitution states, not to the president as the Trade Act of 1974 states.

### **1. Abolish Reciprocal Tariffs**

Reciprocal tariffs have raised prices for the everyday consumers and created tension in global trade. Party Worldwide will abolish all reciprocal tariffs to strengthen global trade stability.

### **2. Abolish Secondary Tariffs**

The third policy protects workers and civilians by prohibiting agencies from imposing secondary tariffs on nations. Secondary tariffs are currently being used to penalize nations that are trading with targeted nations such as Russia. Such tariffs are unfairly punishing the workers and civilians of these nations by eliminating jobs and increasing the prices of products.

The PWCC is estimated to cost the government roughly \$89 billion directly, but is projected to grow economic development in the United States significantly as tariffs gradually decrease. The GDP is expected to grow by around 2-4% per year by eliminating reciprocal tariffs alone.

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## CYBERSECURITY

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Party Worldwide proposes a comprehensive cybersecurity framework known as the “Dale” plan, designed to secure national data, protect critical infrastructure, and maintain U.S. dominance in global cyberspace while remaining economically competitive.

### 1. The “Hustle” Treaty

Party Worldwide will create a Cybersecurity Affairs Board (CAB) composed of participating UN States, mandating information sharing for critical infrastructure and large corporations, establishing universal cyber law enforcement jurisdiction, and regulating corporate cyber development. This initiative would cost the U.S. approximately \$820 million, which falls within the existing \$1.2 billion UN peacekeeping budget. Any member countries that refuse to cooperate must pay a 2.5% tax or will receive none of the benefits of the treaty.

### 2. The “Keep It Real” Act

By implementing encryption standards overseen by CISA to prevent ransomware, the “Keep It Real” Act strengthens domestic protections for sensitive infrastructure such as healthcare and banking systems.

### 3. The “Worldwide Dale International Security” (WWDIS) Act

A national cybersecurity framework requiring continuous security audits under Executive Order 305 will be established. Fines minimum of \$50,000 will be imposed for non-compliance, and a 1.5% tax will be introduced for companies that heavily use encryption and VPN services.

Together, these policies enhance national and global cyber stability and strengthen international cooperation. While the Dale plan costs \$1.6 billion, much of its expense is offset through the taxation mechanisms, making it more cost effective than the current DHS CISA budget and ensuring long term cybersecurity resilience.

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## RUSSIA-UKRAINE

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The Russo-Ukrainian war has become a prolonged war of attrition, making further escalation costly and a decisive Ukrainian victory unlikely. In response, Party Worldwide advances a



strategy centered on maintaining the current line of contact while reducing bloodshed and pursuing a durable ceasefire.

### *Military Aid and Strategy*

Party Worldwide will propose a set of policies that limit excessive U.S. involvement in Ukraine and increase oversight on arms deals to ensure strategic support and eliminate wasted taxpayer money. This movement is made up of three major initiatives, which ought to be proposed as a package set of legislation.

#### **1. Promise Fund Revision**

The first policy in the plan will limit the large-scale promise fund of \$66 billion in weapons aid for the 2025 Fiscal Year with a hard statutory cap at \$15 billion per fiscal year. Funds saved by this cap will be reallocated toward sustainable defensive equipment.

At the start of each fiscal cycle, there will be an annual review of geopolitical conditions, military progress, and financial efficiency to determine whether the cap should be changed, voted on by a  $\frac{2}{3}$  majority in both chambers of Congress. The DOD and State Department restructure security assistance to manage these caps.

#### **2. Weapons Database Reformation**

To increase transparency and reduce waste, Party Worldwide will address the significant lack of oversight on arms given to Ukraine. Every U.S. supplied weapon must be tracked through export, arrival, deployment, and decommissioning using its serial number. Additionally, U.S. inspectors from the GAO and the DOD Inspector general will conduct quarterly on-site audits. Ukraine must also maintain a centralized, online inventory of all U.S. originating weapons and report it to Congress monthly.

Any future arms deal requires the evaluation of corruption, diversion, and security risks. Failure to comply with said policies will result in a pause on transfers until compliance is restored. Fully-implementing tracking, a database, and quarterly inspections will require federal IT infrastructure, likely to cost \$300 million over the next decade.

#### **3. Defensive Systems Expansion**

This act will reduce U.S. provision of high cost long-range missile systems and instead prioritize defense platforms like short-range interceptors, mobile air defense artillery, and counter-drone systems, which generally cost much less to procure and maintain. Furthermore, this act directs the DOD to reallocate saved funds from the \$15 billion cap towards defensive systems, rather than expansion of offensive artillery.



The “Spend a lot, not a Whole lot” Plan is estimated to cost the federal government roughly \$180 million for the federal government and up to \$2 billion for firms over a ten-year plan.

## Peace and Reconstruction

### 1. “Tone It Down” Policy

The United States will continue providing Ukraine with defensive military aid, intelligence, economic assistance, and diplomatic support while limiting escalation by both ending support for long-range strikes into Russian territory and prohibiting U.S and NATO troop presence in Ukraine, overseen by a “Keep It Steady” committee.

### 2. UkraineWide Aid

Party Worldwide will triple U.S. humanitarian assistance delivered through international organizations for the duration of the war. Working with European allies, the U.S. will pursue ceasefire negotiations that include internationally administered referendums in occupied regions (Crimea, Donetsk, Luhansk, and parts of Kherson and Zaporizhzhia) alongside guarantees for Black Sea trade and navigation.

### 3. UkraineWide Rebuild

Party Worldwide will support Ukraine's reconstruction using frozen Russian assets and allied funding, backing Ukraine's accession to the EU while ending NATO membership efforts, and requiring protections for minority, language, and religious rights.

To prevent future conflict, the U.S. will extend security guarantees to Ukraine, monitor Russian military activity, and pursue accountability for war crimes through International Criminal Court, maintaining sanctions on responsible individuals while offering conditional reintegration of Russia into the global economy following a peace agreement.

Ending the war would reduce global energy and food prices and eliminate roughly \$70 billion in ongoing US military aid, while reconstruction costs—estimated at \$524 billion over a decade—would be shared multilaterally and offset by approximately \$300 billion in frozen Russian assets, making this approach less costly than prolonging the war.

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## ARMS CONTROL & NONPROLIFERATION

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Party Worldwide will be operating regarding arms control on a promise to decrease the creation or spread of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) to all countries. This will be achieved through three pieces of legislation, together known as the “Fireball” Plan. The goal of these acts is to



attack nuclear development at the source, uranium; expand American oversight on nuclear affairs and address the abundance of warheads already in service.

### **1. “We’re Bringing it, We’re Bringing it, We’re Bringing it Back” Treaty**

This act seeks to limit the uranium that each country is able to use in exchange for an economic incentive: supply-side nonproliferation. The major nuclear players of the world (United States, Russia, China, France, and the United Kingdom) will all be invited to join this treaty since they possess the most nuclear power under the NPT. By joining this treaty, each state will put 10% of their uranium reserves into storage. The United States will also allow domestic storage sites certified and sealed by US oversight for willing nations. In exchange, there will be a trade agreement that makes foreign trade cheaper within the nations in the treaty. Any nation that withdraws from the treaty will face an automatic tariff snapback and loss of prioritized trade privileges.

### **2. “Roof on Fire” Act**

The goal of this act is to help establish nuclear power plants in less nuclearly-developed countries and maintain United States oversight of these power plants. This act will boost the American economy significantly. Each country will share initial construction costs, up to \$6 billion depending on size, then pay the United States an annual charge for oversight and operations, approximately \$80 million. The United States will prioritize modular reactors (SMRs) to faster deploy cheaper models that are harder to weaponize. This act will also provide American citizens with jobs, to work as the oversight management for these plants. Regional U.S.-led oversight centers will provide administrative oversight over a larger scale of participating nations. To be allowed to participate in this program, nations must be within compliance of the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT) and reduce enrichment to justifiable civilian thresholds. Overall, this act allows the United States to have oversight on other states’ nuclear activities, further preventing the spread of nuclear weapons.

### **3. “We’re Takin’ it, We’re Takin’ it, We’re Takin’ it Down” Act**

This act seeks to address nuclear warheads that are already in existence and in service. This act coincides with the “We’re Bringing it Back” Treaty. As an added part, the aforementioned countries will put any excess warheads into a shared, established storage facility. This facility will be monitored by employees of all nations to ensure no corruption and illegal distribution of the weapons. Complying nations will get decreased tariffs on their goods going into the other countries, expanding trade. The program will initially start with inactive warheads - retired, non-deployed, or maintenance-cycle warheads. The sites for stored warheads must be approved by nations within the NPT, but all nations participating will be allowed to have oversight members present in the international sites. Money saved from reduced warhead maintenance will be reinvested in the development of domestic energy projects.



The “We’re Bringing it, We’re Bringing it, We’re Bringing it Back” Treaty is said to cost the United States roughly \$7.2 billion. This covers building and operating storage facilities for the agreed upon amount of uranium storage. Lower trade costs will raise the US GDP by billions. The “Roof on Fire” Act is a rough estimate. It will cost the United States approximately \$6 billion dollars per nuclear plant that it builds; depending on the plant size. However, this cost will be split with the host country. As well as, the host country making a payment of \$80 million dollars to the United States annually for operational costs, per plant. The “We’re Takin’ it, We’re Takin’ it, We’re Takin’ it Down” Act will cost the United States approximately \$1.44 billion.

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## INTERNATIONAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING PREVENTION

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Party Worldwide will propose a set of policies that aim to address the root causes of exploitation. This will strengthen worker protections, make migration safer, and ensure that human trafficking victims have power in shaping the systems meant to support them. This plan will consist of a set of legislative policies known as the Uno Dos Tres, Stop Trafficking Plan.

### **1. The “WWP” Act**

This Worldwide Worker Protection Act aims to strengthen worker protections across international supply chains to prevent exploitation at the root. This act calls for the reporting of wages, recruitment practices, and subcontractors. These reports would be collected and reviewed by an ILO monitoring unit. Penalties will be imposed on corporations and sanctions that do not comply with sharing their information. A penalty of 6-7% of the corporation's annual gross revenue may be imposed, or a daily fine enforced by the UN sanctions from a minimum of \$5,000-\$10,000 may be mandated. The department will collect and redirect these funds to antitrafficking programs.

### **2. The “Still Here” Program**

The Still Here Program focuses on making migration easier, safer, and more accessible to those who seek refuge in other countries. By offering legal pathways, visas, and migrant resource centers, this program reduces the vulnerability that traffickers exploit, like the lack of legal status and language barriers. This migration program will be funded through existing UN migration systems like the IOM. Additional funding will come from voluntary contributions from multilateral organizations or other donor states.

### **3. “The Survivors Support and Justice” Initiative**

This initiative will create long term housing, job training programs, and advisory boards led by trafficking victims. These advisory boards will be organized and overseen by the UN Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) in coordination with the International Organization for Migration



(IOM), who are already responsible for worldwide antitrafficking work. These services will be provided through a partnership with the International Rescue Committee (IRC), which already offer trauma recovery programs. Funding covers licensed counselors, caseworkers, and social workers hired directly through these organizations using program grants from the UN.

This is estimated to cost the government a minimum of \$100 million over the 4 years of the Uno Dos Tres Plan, shared among UN member states and partner organizations. 45% of this cost will go to Worker Protection, 35% to Migration Protections, and the last 20 % will go to the Survivor Support Initiative, following typical UNODC spending patterns.

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## CHINA-TAIWAN

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### *Military Posture*

The U.S. delegation in diplomatic talks would consist of 9 members, including the Secretary of State and diplomats under that office delegated for both the PRC and Taiwan. Funds cut from arms sales and direct military aid to Taiwan should be used to fund this diplomatic mission, as well as setting up a host city for peace talks in a third country, such as the Philippines or Singapore. Funding should also be allocated to facilitate the drafting of peace treaties, including potential incentives totaling \$1 billion for any agreed to peace treaty, as exemplified in the 1979 Camp David Accords peace treaty facilitated by the U.S.

#### **1. Party Commitment to Cross Recognition and Self Determination**

Party Worldwide should direct diplomatic agencies in China under the U.S State Department to set up and facilitate cross-strait negotiations that are fair and under conditions that both nations previously agree to. The U.S. should be seen as the mediator and simply the one facilitating discussion. The U.S should establish itself as a nation that believes in autonomy of all nations and condemn the use of war as a means to do so. That being said, any breach in Taiwan's autonomy in particular will not be tolerated, and should be met with further diplomatic and potentially negative economic measures on China, although direct military intervention should be ruled out. This process of firm diplomatic pressure is key in order to ensure lasting peace in the region.

#### **2. Peace for \$ Plan: Scaling Back Unnecessary Military Aid**

Party Worldwide is committed to non-interventionalist policy. Scaling back military aid to Taiwan to prevent unnecessary tension between the U.S and China is one key ultimate goal that the party holds. This approximately \$7 billion (yearly) decrease in spending in regards to foreign



military aid should be used to bolster diplomatic and peace programs in the Indo-Pacific region, and any excess thereafter should be used to fund domestic social programs in the United States. The United States should also call upon its allies and use some reallocated diplomatic funding in the region to burden share to support Taiwan, so the United States can lessen its military aid to Taiwan without leaving the nation in the dark.

### **3. Commitment to non-involvement and Peace Incentives for the PRC**

Neither the President, nor the Department of War should have the authority to conduct any strikes in a potential conflict against China unless explicitly authorized by Congress in an explicit Declaration of War. If China is to take meaningful steps towards true intention for peace and recognition of Taiwan's autonomy, the People's Republic should be awarded lower tariff rates and the ending of certain sanctions on China on part of the United States. However, if Chinese aggression is to be ramped up, tariff rates on the country should be allowed to be increased if authorized by Congress in a two-thirds vote. Sanctions should also be continued to be applied in such circumstances.

Cutting direct military aid and arms sales to Taiwan should save the U.S government an average of \$7 billion per year starting in FY 2030. The funds will support more formal ties with Taiwan in the event diplomatic talks are successful. The U.S embassy in China will also receive similar amounts from the Defense spending cuts, In order to increase the capacity to hire new diplomats and increase funds for a host city in any potential talks the U.S Department of State is able to set up between China and Taiwan

## ***Economic Preparedness***

Party Worldwide will propose a policy that will grant specific independent rights for Taiwan and increase the influence of the US over the semiconductor market. This policy will contain 4 major parts, the first two focusing on short term resolutions and two of which focusing on the long term. Collectively, it will be deemed the "Can't Get Enough (Semiconductors)" plan.

### **1. The "I Crossed The Globe When I'm With You Baby" Act**

Party Worldwide will call for a conference with representatives of China in order to ensure transparency about the next set of acts, and to mitigate tensions that have been established previously. China will be assured that the US does not intend to invest in Taiwan's defense capabilities, nor do they intend on selling any military technology, so weapons, artillery, and soldiers will not be of concern for them. However, the US retains its right to its strategic ambiguity, in the case of Chinese invasion to Taiwan.

### **2. "Take the Negatives and turn them into a Positive" Act**



\$5 billion will be granted to Taiwan over the course of ten years in order for them to establish a more expansive and resilient energy infrastructure and to invest in safer and more reliable methods for shipping and transportation. This will ensure that if Taiwan and China were to engage in military conflict, Taiwan's ability for international trade and communication will not be substantially hindered. Thereby, preserving their semi-autonomous nature, and temporarily supporting their supply chain during times of conflict. Taiwan will ONLY receive this grant if they agree to lower their defense budget from the projected 5% of their GDP in 2030 and maintain it at 3% or lower. The AIT will be granted the ability to be the main consultant for these projects, since they have been granted the funds to do so.

### **3. The "Semiconductors Are My Hustle" Act**

Current subsidies for the construction of semiconductor manufacturing facilities would be raised by 50%, approximately \$26.35 billion, allowing for domestic and international companies to consider American territory for their facilities. Tariffs for semiconductors manufactured outside the United States will be raised by 5% for each proceeding year, over the course of ten years, resulting in an additional 50% tariff for semiconductors manufactured outside of the US by 2036. Revenue from the tariffs will be used to fund the subsidies mentioned prior and to support the establishment of an innovation hub to encourage foreign investment in the research and development of semiconductors.

The "Can't Get Enough (Semiconductors)" plan is estimated to cost about \$31.36 billion over the course of 10 years. Although the cost of the plan seems high, the overall turnout from the "Semiconductors Are My Hustle" Act will offset the cost, due to the fact that these investments will bolster the US economy, providing jobs and fostering innovation. In all, with these specific investments, the US GDP is expected to grow by \$434.78 billion.

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## **SUDAN-CONGO**

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The Worldwide Peace and Security Plan (WPASP) solves Sudan's humanitarian collapse at its root causes.

### **1. The Safety Civilian Protection Act**



Party Worldwide will create protected routes monitored by satellite drones, negotiate temporary local cease fires and hold monthly safety reviews. This will cost \$180-220 million per year but is necessary in providing safety in unsafe aid corridors.

## **2. The Timber Forbidden Gold Act**

Sanctions will be placed on the gold trade and foreign weapons suppliers. Party Worldwide aims to freeze their assets and track their records. This will help in the defunding of war through the black market.

## **3. The Hotel Room Service Act**

Party Worldwide will build a US African Union partnership that ties extra help to security, border management and refugee service quotas for Chad, South Sudan and Ethiopia.

The WPASP requires \$500-700 million a year, which is about 10-20% of the UN's 4.2 billion appeal, providing secure delivery of humanitarian aid, reducing the financing of conflict and stabilizing the region.

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# **ISRAEL-PALESTINE**

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## ***Conflict Stabilization***

Party Worldwide recognizes the natural right of Palestinians for self-determination. We seek a solution in which regional conflict is limited and a long-term resolution is achieved, not through military intervention or economic influence, but through recognition, market cooperation, and fiscal restraint.

### **1. This Chico Right Here Don't Play Act**

All U.S. military funding to Israel and Palestine will be reduced. Funds will instead be redirected to the reconstruction of Palestine while maintaining no support for either side during the conflict. Party Worldwide's aim is to, after 2 years, leave the Middle East in a position where it can stand on its own.

### **2. Global Mediation Act**

The U.S. will play a diplomatic role over the two years, with military involvement implemented only if U.S. citizens are in direct danger. In this role of diplomacy, the U.S. may hold conferences in which it maintains neutrality and helps both sides reach an agreement. The



importance lies in that, during policy integration, we support both sides in agreeing on acceptable terms.

### **3. Free Trade Act**

We also propose a free trade agreement among the U.S., Israel, and Palestine to foster economic benefits for the private sectors of all three states. The rules of free trade will be agreed upon by the three states and implemented only after consensus has been reached. The purpose of this act is to stimulate the respective economies without political influence.

Conflict stabilization is estimated to cost \$4.1 billion annually.

## ***Statebuilding***

It is clear that the United States needs to pursue a different path towards the genocide in Gaza. Because of the significant losses on both sides of the conflict between the two nations of people, creating a statehood plan that satisfies both groups is impossible. However, we can create a solution that protects the interests of Israelis and Palestinians. Party Worldwide will maintain a strong commitment throughout our Israel-Palestine policy to protecting human rights above all else.

### **1. International Justice Initiative**

To ensure that United States foreign policy is in accordance with humanitarian law, we will first formally recognize the International Criminal Court and cooperate with its rulings. Therefore, any individual convicted of war crimes or crimes against humanity will be arrested if present in the U.S., in accordance with international law. The U.S. will also provide resources and funding to any future ICC investigations to ensure global justice.

### **2. Unified Democracy Act**

After aiding in reconstruction and humanitarian aid, the U.S. will collaborate with the United Nations and regional actors to create a single, democratic state encompassing Israel and Palestine. The state will be a unitary democracy with a centralized government to ensure political representation for all citizens and avoid fragmented governance. Legislative representation will be based on percentage of votes rather than winners of individual voting districts to prevent gerrymandering and ensure equal representation. Voting will be done through a ranked-choice system to help prevent extremist candidates from gaining power. An independent electoral commission will also be created and monitored by the UN to ensure elections are fair and conflict-free. Term limits will be instituted to prevent any one party gaining excess power.

### **3. Constitution Safeguards Act**



The new state's government will be based on a newly-created constitution. It will contain protections for rights such as freedom of speech and press. These rules will legally define what constitutes parties that will be allowed to participate in elections (racial, ethnic, or religious supremacy; advocacy for violence against civilians; intending to undermine democratic systems), and compliance will be monitored by the Independent Electoral Commission.

#### **4. Resilient Governance and Security Act**

Police and security forces within the state must be committed to public safety and trust. Because of this, a thorough vetting process will be required to join such forces, and violent actions by police forces will be investigated, with unnecessary violence carrying severe consequences. Any such offenses will be taken seriously and punished with incarceration.

The government will need to be prepared to prevent destabilization and ensure that the population at large feels adequately protected by their representatives. Rapid-response units will be created to deal with outbreaks of violence, providing immediate medical support in the event of terrorist attacks. They will be well trained to handle attacks while minimizing civilian harm. The U.S. will work with local authorities to monitor extremist groups and prevent any known attacks from happening before harm befalls the public.

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## **COUNTERTERRORISM**

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Party Worldwide will emphasize the fiscal responsibility of reducing military spending, the importance of protecting civil liberties, and the need to address the underlying factors that contribute to international radicalization.

#### **In the Middle East, Party Worldwide will:**

1. Provide economic aid for institutions that aim to reduce conditions that can lead to extremist beliefs. A grant of \$500 million will go to institutions in: Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Syria, Afghanistan, Sudan, Yemen, Libya, Egypt, Lebanon, and Palestine, and, as many of these countries are currently governed by terror groups, oversight of the use of aid from the AmeriCorps and UN. This aid will also be used to create sustainable access to necessities like food, water, and shelter for foreigners.
2. Collaborate with Middle Eastern leaders to build peace plans, create diplomatic ties, improve economic relations, and withdraw the majority of active-duty troops to ensure Party Worldwide does not risk the lives of innocent civilians and soldiers with unnecessary military involvement.



3. Initiate and support efforts that promote democratic governance and ensure the preservation of human liberties with the goal of advancing future stability in problematic regions. Counterintelligence operations will be carried out by a collaboration of UN member governments and will be used to decrease the participation of non-regional characters on the financing, arming, and ideological support of terrorist groups.

**In Africa, Party Worldwide will:**

1. Address the root causes of instability, like poverty and lack of education by investing in large-scale infrastructure projects such as roads and schools to fulfill short-term needs and spark long-term economic growth. This will cost the United States \$100 million annually for the next 5 years.
2. Fund the construction of schools in disadvantaged areas that lack resources and ensure free education for children through high school. This plan will cost the United States \$50 million USD annually for the next 10 years.
3. Work with the African Union (AU) to strengthen regional stability by decreasing government corruption through the establishment of anti-corruption agencies that oversee government actions and finances to ensure they are not supporting extremist doctrine.

The entire plan is estimated to cost America roughly \$46.5 billion over a ten-year period. These policies are not likely to affect the overall cost spent on counterterrorism currently as most of the money used for aid will come from the reduction of troops and combat zones overseas.



**CHAPTER TEN**  
**Immigration**

# **A WORLD WIDE**





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## FOREIGN BORDER SECURITY STRATEGY

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Party Worldwide Border Restoration Plan will make the U.S. border more open to immigrants wishing to enter the country while keeping it secure from people with negative intentions. Our goals are to promote cooperation with foreign countries, eliminate obsolete security measures, and streamline the immigration process.

### **1. The Global Effort Agreement**

This policy will open the U.S. up to working with Mexico & countries in Central and South America by offering incentives that include assistance in establishing infrastructure through creating a team of 2,000 engineers that provide humanitarian aid through the use of the USAID to people in need within cooperating countries; and giving \$25 million grants, with the purpose of reducing socioeconomic differences and rates of violence. These incentives will be provided only to cooperating countries that agree to meet quotas in crime reduction & socioeconomic equality.

### **2. The Return to Simplicity Initiative**

A major driver of people choosing to enter the United States illegally is the inefficiency of the immigration process. To bring humanitarianism to the immigration process, the U.S. will simplify it. To do this, the U.S. will modernize asylum laws to make quicker and fairer decisions for asylum seekers by implementing a reevaluation of asylum laws every 4 years where changes can be proposed instead of as frequently as it occurs now. The U.S. will also provide pro-bono government-appointed counseling in asylum proceedings to individuals, increase funding and staffing for agencies such as USCIS and CBP to process cases quicker and prevent bottlenecks of applications, and reform applications for entry by combining the different petition types into a single type for consistency and providing adequate legal assistance for navigating immigration law.

### **3. The Necessary Security Act**

This act will see the U.S. roll back much of its current security at the border by completely eliminating the use of any AI at the border and remove the military from the U.S. border. To compensate for this sudden cut in security, the U.S. will provide increased funding to CBP. This funding is to be used so as to increase numbers to compensate for the elimination of military personnel use, improve training and improve existing computer systems to get the organic security of the border to a relatively similar level to the previous system.

The Border Restoration Plan will cost \$8.8 billion to enact over the course of a year.



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## CROSS-BORDER DIPLOMACY

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Party Worldwide will propose a series of policies aimed to ensure the security of our borders, appropriately manage the flow of immigration into our country, cooperate with our partner states, & comply with international law. Our series will consist of reforms to immigration law, restructuring in funding, the establishment of new programs, & the passing of new legislation, under the title of “The Global Movement.”

### 1. “Borders, not Bullies” Bill

To achieve our goals, we are to change federal funding for the various immigration systems in place today. We will cut funding substantially for ICE by \$80 billion & redirect its resources to other entities such as embassies & consulates in other countries to aid foreign citizens looking to enter our country, CBP & the DEA to fight the drug trade across our border, the opening of the Foreign Labor Administration, & investment into foreign economies to fight the root cause of the drug trade: economic hardship & unstable governance.

### 2. Globetrotter Initiative

Violations of visa guidelines will be reformed as follows:

- a) The passing of a visa’s duration will not subject the migrant to deportation but instead allow a 3-month grace period for them to renew it with a corresponding facility.
- b) Violation of a visa due to committing a crime would not result in deportation, but instead result in penalization within the United States.

### 3. Foreign Labor Administration

This new government entity will promote economic growth by encouraging foreign workers to immigrate to the United States by directly giving employment opportunities. These opportunities will include highway work, park maintenance, construction, & more industries in which immigrant labor is prevalent, through federal contracts. In conjunction with this purpose, the FLA will reach out to corporations that face labor shortages & provide foreign laborers to fill in manpower gaps, with the laborers maintaining a government contract.

“The Global Movement” will necessitate a budget of \$100 billion to implement its policies. However, \$80 billion will be redirected from ICE’s current \$85 billion budget towards funding these policies. Our reformation of immigration will encourage net positive economic growth while ensuring immigrants receive humane conditions & fair opportunities.
